

PARLIAMENT HOUSE SHAKEN

Canberra Earth Tremor

Debate Not Interrupted

CANBERRA, Wednesday. — The series of earth tremors in Canberra in the last two days culminated about 4.30 p.m. to-day in the most severe and pronounced tremor felt there. The shock, which lasted for about a minute, was accompanied by a rumbling noise. The House of Representatives was sitting when the tremor occurred. In the massive Houses of Parliament the House of Representatives Chamber vibrated and the galleries swayed noticeably. Members of the House did not allow the tremor to interrupt a debate on the motion for the adjournment of the House.

VISITORS LEAVE GUNNING

Booming Sounds Give Concern

SYDNEY, Wednesday. — Continued earth tremors, followed by the second severe shock this afternoon, are causing alarm in the Gunning district. Since the earthquake on Monday morning tremors, accompanied by low ominous booming sounds, have been occurring. Several visitors have left the district, and even persons who have been living at Gunning for years have become anxious. At 4.32 p.m. to-day a very sharp shock was recorded at Riverview Observatory.

Slight Tremor at Wagga

WAGGA (N.S.W.), Wednesday. — A slight earth tremor was felt in the western outskirts of Wagga to-day. A shop window and a shop wall were cracked.
